HRS Section 607-5.7 requires the Fund Administrator to have at least one year's experience in administering grants to providers of civil legal services for indigents. Due to the Hawaii Justice Foundation's (HJF) specific experience and the absence of other suitable providers, the Judiciary selected HJF as the Fund Administrator for ILAF.
